1. General information

Castellón de la Plana

Castellón de la Plana is a Mediterranean city on the Costa del Azahar in eastern Spain, located around 75 km north of Valencia, between the sea and the mountains of the Desert de les Palmes Natural Park. With its pleasant climate, lively squares, orange-tree gardens and nearby beaches, Castellón offers a combination of history, culture and nature. The city has a charming historic centre, a rich local tradition and easy access to the coast. It is also an excellent base for discovering the wider province, known for its beautiful beaches, picturesque towns and valuable natural heritage.

The City's Origin

Castellón de la Plana was officially founded in 1251, when King James I authorized the transfer of the settlement from its original hilltop location to the fertile plain, where the city stands today. This decision marked the beginning of the development of the new town and remains one of the key moments in the history of Castellón.

The memory of this transfer is still closely linked to local tradition and identity. It is connected to the annual pilgrimage to the Chapel of Mary Magdalene, a symbolic place associated with the earliest origins of the city.

During the Middle Ages, Castellón gradually developed as a centre of agriculture, trade and artisan activity. Its growth was supported by irrigation from the River Mijares, the expansion of the urban area and its increasing connection to the sea, which later contributed to the importance of the port.

In the following centuries, Castellón strengthened its role as an administrative and economic centre in the region. Over time, the city continued to grow while preserving the memory of its origin, traditions and strong local character.

Today, Castellón de la Plana is a modern Mediterranean city that combines history, cultural heritage and development, while remaining proud of its roots and identity.

El Pinar Beach

Its fine golden sand makes it to be one of the most visited beaches in this area, but its extension and width allow it to have a quiet atmosphere. It has amphibian chairs and all necessary services to make possible that people with reduced mobility can access the beach and the sea.

The Weather

Castellón enjoys a Mediterranean climate with more than 300 days of sunshine per year, mild winters and warm, pleasant summers. The average annual temperature is around 18°C, making the city an excellent destination for outdoor activities throughout the year.

At the end of May, weather conditions in Castellón are usually very comfortable for sport and outdoor events, with average daytime temperatures of around 22°C and night temperatures of around 14°C. Rainfall is generally low during this period, which makes late May a favourable time to visit and compete in Castellón.

3. Arrivals

3.1. Arrival by air

Castelló Airport (around 25 km from the city of Castelló) and Manises/Valencia Airport (about 90 km from the city of Castelló) are the official airports. Further airports may be used as alternative airports, upon previous agreement with the LOC and at the Clubs' costs.

Transfer times from the official airports are as follows:

- From Castelló Airport to the official Hotels 20 minutes
- From Manises/Valencia Airport to the official Hotels 1h00m

3.2. Welcome Service

The Welcome Desk shall be situated at the Official airport arrivals terminals and will be open from Thursday 21 May 2026 (depending on travel schedules communicated by the teams).

Upon arrival, teams will be met by the LOC or team attachés. Look out for your attaché with your club's name on a board as you leave the baggage hall. Once luggage has been collected, team members will be escorted to buses which will take them to their Hotels.

3.3. Transportation of Equipment

The LOC will provide transport for the delivery of personal implements and vaulting poles. Upon arrival at the airport athletes are responsible for taking their personal implements and vaulting poles to the Welcome Desks, where LOC team members will assist. Personal implements and vaulting poles must be clearly marked with name and club/country signs to ensure that they do not get lost.

Teams arriving until 20:00 on Friday 22 May will stop at the Stadium Complejo Deportivo Gaetà Huguet en-route to the Hotels to drop off the vaulting poles and implements to be stored/checked in a safe/dedicated place at the Stadium.

For the Teams arriving after 20:00 on Friday 22 May, the personal implements and vaulting poles will be taken directly to the Hotels. Their vaulting poles and implements will be transported by the LOC from the Hotels to the Stadium on Saturday 23 May at 10:00 to be stored/checked.

After the competition personal implements will be transported by the LOC from the Stadium field of play to the TIC so the teams are collecting them.

After the competition, the LOC will take the Vaulting poles to the teams' Hotels and further transportation will be arranged by the organisers as required.

3.4. Arrival by train

There will be no Welcome Desk at the main railway station in Castellón.

Teams arriving by train will be met by LOC representatives and taken to their Hotel, according to the arrival times given in the final entry system.

3.5. Arrival by road

Teams arriving by road until 20:00 on Friday 22 May, are asked to come directly to the Stadium to drop off the personal implements and vaulting poles to be stored/checked in a safe/dedicated place at the Stadium.

Teams arriving after 20:00 on Friday 22 May, are kindly asked to go directly to their Hotel, where representatives from the LOC will welcome them. Their vaulting poles and implements will be transported by the LOC from the Hotels to the Stadium on Saturday 23 May at 10:00 to be stored/checked.

4. Visa requirements

Visas should be obtained before leaving your country, from the Spain Embassy or Consulate, well in advance to ensure all the procedures in due time.

The following participating country nationals require visa to enter Spain:

- Turkey

Participants who require a visa should contact the LOC as soon as possible (until 1 May 2019) to obtain a special invitation letter and visa application information.

- Passport Number and Passport Expiry Date (passports should be valid at least 6 months after the end of the competition)

5. Transport

5.1. Transportation Desks

The Transportation Desks will be located in the lobby of Hotels with qualified personnel offering relevant information about all aspects of the ECCC Track & Field Senior Group A.

5.2. Bus shuttle service

The transfer to the Technical Meeting from Eurohotel and Trinimar will take place by cars (08:30, from the Information Desks) and the return will take place by cars as well (09:45). For further information, please check the Information/Transportation Desk at your Hotel.

5.3. Return to airport / train stations

Transport will be arranged according to the flight schedules submitted by the teams. Further information will be available from the Hotel Information/Transportation Desks. In case teams' travel plans change after the Final Entries closing date teams may have to assume an extra fee to support eventual extra transportation expenses.

6. Accommodation & hotel information

6.1. General information

The LOC has reserved accommodation for all teams at the Bonaire Hotel, Trinimar Hotel, Eurohotel Castelló and Hotel Intur Orange, providing full board accommodation. Bonaire Hotel, Trinimar and Hotel Orange Intur are located approximately 10 km from the Castellón centre and the Stadium. Eurohotel Castellón is walking distance from the city centre and 10 minutes walking distance from the Stadium.

6.2. Information Desks

The Information Desks will be located in the lobby of Hotels with qualified personnel offering relevant information about all aspects of the European Champion Clubs Cup Track & Field Senior Group A.

The teams' Hotels allocation will be defined after the Final Entries and communicated to the teams as soon as available.

6.4. Costs and European Foundation quota

According to Regulation 1410.1 the organising club undertakes to cover accommodation and full board costs of each participating team (except the host) for one (1) night more than days of competition. The maximum number of quota team members to be covered per participating team (except host) is 22 athletes and 4 officials.

According to Regulation 1410.6.1, the following contribution must be paid to the organising club by each participating club team (except host):

Registration fee: EUR 1000, - which must be paid at the latest by the date of the closing of the preliminary entries.

Accommodation support: EUR 2500, - to be paid latest upon arrival to the venue.

The following rates must be paid for “out of quota” team members and additional days:

- Full board price
- All prices include meals and VAT.
- The out-of-quota meals will be charging 25€ per meal.
- All Clubs will be accommodated at hotels located on Castellon city or Benicasin city which is around 15km far from Castellón

Each team will be allocated a minimum number of single rooms equivalent to 10% of the total number of athletes and officials within the quota.

Late check-out is available at an additional cost of €70 per room. In such cases, the room may be used until 18:00.

All payments must be made in Euros (€), by credit card or by bank transfer.

The team leader must settle any extra charges (bar, laundry, telephone etc.) at the Hotel Reception desk, before departure. The team leader will be requested to provide a credit card at the time of checking in at the reception desk to cover any extras or eventual damage caused by the team.

An invoice will be sent in advance to each club detailing the amount they owe based on the numbers declared in the Final Entries and this shall be paid in full, according the Regulation 1410.7., no allowance being made for subsequent any reduction in the actual numbers of athletes and/or officials.

Note. Any participating club team, not paid the registration fee by the date specified above, shall be liable to pay the registration fee increased by 25%.

Accreditation cards (which will be given to teams upon arrival) will allow access to meals.

For lunch and dinner mineral water will be available free of charge. All other drinks must be paid for.

All food restrictions (celiac, vegan, vegetarian, etc.) should be communicated to the LOC in advance.

A late serving provision will be made for those athletes detained at the Stadium due to doping controls or protests.

Teams leaving immediately after the competition may request dinner boxes from the Hotels no later than 10:00 on Sunday 24 May at the Information Desks at the Hotels.

7. Meeting rooms for teams

Arrangements can be made for team meeting rooms through the Information Desks at the Hotels. Requests shall be made at a reasonable time in advance.

8. Telephone calls

The telephone will be automatically activated to make room-to-room calls. Any athletes or delegation officials requiring the use of the room phone for outgoing calls must make arrangements with the Information Desks at the Hotels. The telephone will be made available upon the presentation of a credit card to cover all charges.

9. Accreditation

9.1. General

Each team member will receive an accreditation card, which must be worn at all times and should be clearly visible. Security personnel will control all areas. The accreditation is not transferable and does not allow the holder to take another person beyond checkpoints. Photos are not required for the accreditation card system.

9.2. Accreditation procedure

There will be dedicated Accreditation Centres which will work in cooperation with the Information/Transportation Desks whose opening hours will be as follows, from 21 to 25 May:

- Thursday 21 May 08:00-22:00 (depending on arrivals)
- Friday 22 May 08:00-22:00 (depending on arrivals)
- Saturday 23 May 08:00-22:00
- Sunday 24 May 08:00-22:00
- Monday 25 May 08:00-12:00 (depending on departures).

Accreditation cards will be prepared in advance of the event, based on the information provided by the Member Federation in the final entry system.

The Team Leaders will be asked to complete the following formalities before they can collect the accreditation cards for the whole team:

- LOC accommodation invoice
- Check of athletes' passport (to allow verification of all participants' age)
- Team vest check
- Insurance policy to cover illness or injury of the registered team members
- Final confirmation of entries

- Collection of competition related forms, competition numbers (Bibs) and information
- Confirmation of departure details

9.3. Lost of accreditation cards

Any lost or damaged accreditation cards should be reported to the Information Desks. Duplicate cards can be obtained where proof of identity can be established.

9.4. Access areas for teams

A description of the accreditation system is included on the back of the accreditation card according to Appendix 5.

10. Technical Information

10.1. Technical information center (TIC)

The main function of the centre is to ensure smooth communication between each Team Delegation, the LOC, the Technical Delegate, ECF and the Competition Administration, regarding technical matters.

The TIC is located on the second floor of the Stadium (please see Appendix 3) and will be open at the following times:

- Thursday 21 May 15:00 – 20:00
- Friday 22 May 15:00 – 20:00
- Saturday 23 May 14:40 – 21:30
- Sunday 24 May 14:20 – 21:00

The TIC will be linked to all Information Desks set up for this event and shall be responsible for the following:

- Competition information (Start Lists, Results, etc)
- Liaison points concerning technical matters between Team Officials, the Technical Delegate, ECF and the LOC
- Urgent notices – collection and delivery of any urgent written notices to the Team Delegations from the Technical Delegate, ECF and the LOC
- Settlement of technical enquiries from delegations
- Recovery of confiscated items at the Call Room
- Applications for ‘national records’ (doping control and photo finish prints)
- Receipt of final declaration of members of relay teams
- Receipt of protests from the teams

10.2. Technical meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held on Saturday 23 May at 09:00, at Hotel Orange. Each team may be represented by a maximum of two people and, if necessary, an interpreter. It is very important that all teams are represented at the Technical Meeting.

All questions related to the Technical Meeting must be presented in writing, preferably in English, at the TIC/Hotels’ Information/Transportation Desks before 21:00 Friday 22 May. The Technical Meeting will be conducted in English.

The Technical Meeting will be attended by:

- European Clubs Foundation Delegates
- Representatives of the Local Organising Committee
- Chief Technical Officials
- TIC Representatives
- Competition Director

Final start lists will be ready before the Technical Meeting.

10.3. Agenda

The preliminary agenda of the Technical Meeting includes:

- Welcome by the President of the Local Organising Committee
- Welcome by the European Clubs Foundation
- Information briefing by the Technical Delegate
 - Call-room procedures and schedule
 - Allocation of lanes and starting order
 - Starting height and bar raising increments
 - Scoring and ties
 - Timetable amendments (if any)
- Information briefing by the Doping Control Delegate
- Victory Ceremonies,
- Answering of questions submitted in writing by the clubs

11. Implements

The implements provided by the LOC (see implement list, Appendix 2) are selected from those appearing on the current WA approved equipment list.

Personal implements will also be allowed, providing that:

- They are readily identifiable and are WA They have been checked for compliance with WA Rules
- They are made available to all other athletes until the end of the event

The LOC will provide transport for the delivery of personal implements and vaulting poles. Upon arrival at the airport athletes are responsible for taking their personal implements and vaulting poles to the Welcome Desks, where LOC team members will assist. Personal implements and vaulting poles must be clearly marked with name and club/country signs to ensure that they do not get lost.

Teams arriving until 20:00 on Friday 22 May will stop at the Stadium Complejo Deportivo Gaetà Huguet en-route to the Hotels to drop off the vaulting poles and implements to be stored/checked in a safe/dedicated place at the Stadium.

For the Teams arriving after 20:00 on Friday 22 May, the personal implements and vaulting poles will be taken directly to the Hotels and from the Hotels to the Stadium on Saturday 23 May at 10:00 to be stored/checked.

If approved, the implements will be under the authority of the LOC from the time of checking to the end of the event, being kept in a locked store and brought to the competition site in due time by the LOC. If not approved, the corresponding teams shall be informed accordingly by the LOC by telephone/dedicated form, so the implements may be collected at the Stadium TIC.

After the competition personal implements will be transported by the LOC from the Stadium field of play to the TIC so the teams are collecting them.

After the competition, the LOC will take the Vaulting poles to the teams' Hotels and further transportation will be arranged by the organisers as required.

12. Inspection of competition venue

Heads of Delegation may visit the competition venue between 18:00 and 19:00 on Friday 22 May inspecting access routes and other facilities. The meeting point will be at the TIC, at 18.00. The visit will be accompanied by LOC personnel.

13. Competition area

The Competition venue is Complejo Deportivo Gaetà Huguet. The Stadium and its surroundings are shown in Appendix 3 of this document. There are 2800 seats.

The Stadium has the following competition sites (to be used in the competition):

- 8 lanes
- 1 High Jump site
- 1 Pole Vault site
- 1 Long/Triple Jump site
- 1 Shot Put Circle
- 1 Combined Discus/Hammer Circle
- 1 Javelin site

The Warm up area has the following sites:

- 6 lanes on the straight (indoor)
- 500m artificial grass
- 1 weightlifting room
- There is no separate throwing or jumping warm up areas

14. Dressing rooms

Dressing rooms with showers are located in the main building at the Stadium and will be accessible for all participants (please, see the map from Appendix 3).

15. Training

The training sessions will be taking place at the competition venue on Thursday and Friday 21 and 22 May:

- From 15:00 to 16:00 for Hammer Throwers
- From 16:00 to 17:00 for Discus Throwers
- From 17:00 to 18:00 for Javelin Throwers

- From 18:00 to 20:00 for all other athletes.

Equipment and implements necessary for training will be available at the training venue. Officials will be present to help in the case of problems or special requirements. Water will be available at the training venue. Accreditation must be handed in when borrowing equipment, and will be returned to the athletes when the equipment is handed back in.

IMPORTANT: do not leave any personal or team belongings in dressing rooms. The LOC will take no responsibility for them in case of loss.

The Weightlifting training room is located on the ground floor (see Appendix 3). The opening hours will be from 14:30 to 20:00 on Thursday and Friday 21 and 22 May.

The transport schedule will be displayed at the Transportation Desks at the Hotels.

1.1. Training with Official Starters

The training with an official starter will take place at the competition venue on Friday 22 May from 19:00 to 20:00.

16. Competition regulations

There will be 20 men's events and 20 events for women. According to the European Clubs Foundation 1402.3.1 only clubs recognised by the Member Federation as National Champions of the preceding year are eligible in the ECCC Track & Field Senior. If the Champion club is not able to take part, then the Member Federation may nominate the second placed club and so on.

Only athletes aged at least 16 (sixteen) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the ECCC Track & Field Senior, in accordance with WA Rules.

A Club may only select national or foreign athletes to compete in the ECCC Track & Field Senior who are eligible under the Member Federation terms of eligibility at the date in the year in which the ECCC Track & Field Senior is held. Provided that such an athlete is a bona fide member of that club for a period starting at least on 4 April of the year of the ECCC Track & Field Senior.

An athlete cannot compete for 2 different clubs which participate in at least one of the ECCC competitions of the same year.

Member Federations must provide the list of their **eligible national and foreign athletes** to European Athletics by 31 January of the year of the competition.

Selected foreign athletes must comply with the WA & Member Federation's rules of qualification currently in force and must present their resident card or passport.

The number of foreign athletes is strictly limited to two (2) for each club team in ECCC Track & Field Senior.

The Technical Delegate reserves the right to inspect resident cards or passports.

Each club team shall consist of one athlete in each event, except relays.

Each athlete can take part in a maximum of three events of which at least one must be a relay-race

The participating club teams shall be into a Group A which will include all entered Clubs and also the Organizer Club

Please refer to the updated version of the event's regulations of European Clubs Foundation ECCC Track & Field Senior

17. Competition entry procedures

17.1. Preliminary Entries

No later than 3 (three) months before the first day of the ECCC Track & Field Senior, each member federation shall send to European Athletics the preliminary number of athletes and accompanying officials, together with their travel details and accommodation requests.

Each participating team must pay a registration fee of EUR 1000, to be paid at the latest by the date of the closing of the preliminary entries

17.2. Final Entries

Not later than 10 (ten) days (14:00 CET) before the first day of the ECCC Track & Field Seniors, each Member Federation shall send to the European Clubs Foundation a final list of its athletes, plus the names of accompanying officials. Final Entry information shall be supplied in the manner prescribed by European Clubs Foundation and shall include such details as required by European Clubs Foundation, including the names and best performances of each athlete.

Deadline for the Final Entries:

13 May 14.00 CET

17.3. Final Confirmations

Team Leaders or their representatives must confirm the names of those competitors already entered who will actually take part in the competition.

In case of late injuries, replacement of initially entered athletes will be allowed until the final confirmation deadline. However, no additional athletes will be accepted, but substitutes by an athlete who is on the list of eligible athletes provided by the respective clubs only.

Forms for the final declaration and confirmation will be sent in advance to late arriving teams by email and distributed to each delegation during accreditation. The forms must be completed and returned immediately or no later than Friday 22 May at 16:00, at the TIC/Hotels' Information Desks. Any club foreseeing to arrive later than this deadline shall confirm the respective team's participation via email to joseluis.decarlos@european-athletics.org

Maximum 2 athletes per team will be allowed to compete in 100m Extra races. Entries must be delivered during accreditation, together with Final Confirmations, until 22 May at 16:00, at the TIC/Hotels' Information Desks.

The final relay team and the running order must be submitted to the TIC using the respective form no later than one hour before the published first call time of the event.

17.4. Withdrawal

Withdrawal of any confirmed athlete must be indicated to the TIC at the Stadium in writing on the official withdrawal form.

18. Scoring

The winner of each individual event and each relay in each match shall score as many points as there are teams competing, the second will score one fewer, and so on. Athletes or relay teams disqualified or not finishing shall not score.

If two or more athletes tie for a place in any event, the attributable points shall be divided equally between them.

The team having the highest aggregate number of points shall be the winner of the match, and so on.

If two or more club teams have the same aggregate number of points, the tie shall be decided in favour of the club team having the greater number of event winners. If the tie still remains it shall be decided in favour of the club team having the greater number of second places, and so on.

19. Bib Numbers

The LOC will provide the teams with 3 (three) bibs (one bib with number and two official Club code bib) with the accreditation, at the Accreditation Centres, as follows:

- Each athlete must wear the bib with the Club code on his/her front as on his/her back each athlete must wear bib with the number
- Exceptions are made for jumping events: these competitors are permitted to attach the Club code bib only to the front or to the back of their competition clothing (plus their tracksuit and bag)
- The third bib with the Club code shall be used on the back of the athletes' tracksuits.

Bibs must not be cut, folded or covered in any way.

20. Competition clothing

The competition and the warm-up attire of the athletes representing qualified clubs in the ECCC events may have advertising, as permitted, under the regulations of the respective Member Federations. If a Member Federation's regulations differ from WA Advertising Regulations in regard to clothing of athletes, Member Federation's regulations shall prevail for the ECCC events, on exceptional basis.

Participating clubs or corresponding Member Federations must provide European Clubs Foundation/LOC with a full set of photographs of their club team uniforms (preferably in an

electronic version) by 13 May 2026 and will have the obligation to wear them throughout the competition:

- JPEG file, maximum resolution and size 300 dpi / 500KB
- Compressed ZIP file, if possible
- Mail to: joseluis.decarlos@european-athletics.org / info@atletismecastello.es

All competitors must wear a registered vest of the same design and colour of the club they are representing.

21. Lane and starting order

Field Events

The order of attempts in the field events has been decided by a draw conducted by European Clubs Foundation for each respective discipline separately. In the horizontal field events, the starting order of attempts is to be held for the first three rounds. The order of the attempts for 4th and 5th rounds is to be in the reverse order based on the ranking after the 3rd round. The order of attempts for the last (6th) round is to be in the reverse order based on the ranking after the 5th round.

Track Events

The heats for the track events from 100m to 800m inclusively are to be arranged by the Technical Delegate considering as much information as possible about the performances of the participating athletes. Normally, the best performers compete in the same heat. A seeding list is to be defined by the Technical Delegate for that purpose.

Once the heats are arranged, the lane distribution is to be conducted by the Technical Delegate as per the WA TR 20.4.2, with the required adaptations, and using the seeding list mentioned above.

The results of the two heats are amalgamated, with the athletes' times determining their placing. In case of a tie between athletes in the different heats for races up to 800m inclusively and the relays, the photo finish judge shall consider the actual times to the 1/1000th of a second. If the tie cannot be broken the attributable points shall be divided equally between them.

For 4x100m and 4x400m relays, the teams' distribution per heat will be according to the teams scoring standings 1 (one) hour before the scheduled time for each event. The best scored teams will compete in the same heat which shall be the last event of the session of track events. The results of the two heats are amalgamated, as per the Competition Regulations.

For 1500m, 3000m, 5000m and 3000m SC, the starting positions distribution is to be done by draw for each respective discipline separately.

22. Starting heights

Initial heights for Track & Field Seniors shall not be lower than as follows:

High Jump	Men: 1.80m	Women: 1.50m
Pole Vault	Men: 4.00m	Women: 3.00m

23. Competition procedure

23.1. Timetable

Please refer to Appendix 1 for the competition timetable.

23.2. Warming up before events

Warming up will take place as per point 7.5 above.

23.3. Call room procedures

The Call Room is located at the Stadium (see Appendix 3). It is the responsibility of the team managers to ensure that their athletes are aware of the last check-in times for entry to the Call Room. Athletes arriving late may be excluded from participation in the event.

All athletes must report to the Call Room before each event and will then be escorted to the competition site as follows:

Running Events	20 min	13 min	10 min
Hurdles	22 min	18 min	12 min
Horizontal Jumps & Throwing Events	40 min	33 min	30 min

The following checks will be carried out on equipment that must comply with IAAF and Competition Rules:

- Competition clothing
- Shoes
- Non-authorized equipment (radio, i-pod, mobile phone, camera, etc.) are not brought infield.

A detailed Call Room timetable will be displayed and circulated to the teams (please see Appendix 1)

23.4. Competition preparation

23.4.1. Trials in Field events

In all field events, except High Jump and Pole Vault, each competitor shall be entitled to take 3 attempts and the best 8 athletes will have another 3 attempts.

23.4.2. Track events

Tracksuits shall be placed in baskets at the Call Room. The baskets will be taken by LOC volunteers to the Kit Collection Area (area at the entrance of the indoor warm-up area - right behind the indoor long jump pit – see Appendix 3) for collection after the race.

23.4.3. Starter's commands

The starter's commands will be given in English.

The starter's command for the distances up to and including 400m and 4x400m relay are:

- "On your marks",
- "Set",
- *Fire of the gun.*

For distances of 800m and over, the commands will be:

- "On your marks",
- *Fire of the gun.*

If for any reason the starter feels it is necessary to interrupt the process, he/she will say:

- "Stand Up".

23.4.4. Leaving the stadium during the competition

An athlete may only leave the competition area when accompanied by a judge. The intention must be communicated to the Referee.

23.4.5. Leaving the stadium after the competition

After the competition, athletes immediately leave the infield through the mixed zone where media interviews will be carried out.

Any protest shall be made orally to the relevant Referee in the infield by an athlete or someone acting on behalf of an athlete, during the event or immediately after the event. The decision of the Referee will be final, and no further appeals will be allowed. Video Recording and Control System will be used extensively to support immediate decisions by the Referee.

Where the appropriate Referee is not accessible or available, the protest should be made through the TIC. Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event (time of publication recorded in the pdf result sheets displayed on the results platform of the competition).

24. Doping control

24.1. General information

Doping controls will be conducted in accordance with World Athletics Anti-Doping Rules which are compliant with the WADA code in force since 1 January 2021.

Athletes selected for doping control shall be informed by trained chaperone. Athletes will be required to sign a doping control notification form. Athletes have the right to

be accompanied to the Doping Control Station (DCS) by an accredited team representative of their choice.

A selected athlete should report immediately to the DCS unless there are valid reasons for the delay. All selected athletes will be accompanied by a trained chaperone or Doping Control Officer from the time of notification until arrival at the DCS. Athletes are reminded that refusing or failing to comply with the Anti-Doping procedures may constitute an Anti-Doping rule violation and could render them liable to disqualification and may result in further disciplinary action. Athletes who are required to use prescribed medication for the treatment of a medical condition should ensure that they have registered their medication, where necessary, through the Therapeutic Use Exemption system prior to attending the Championships.

The selection of Athletes for control will be made on a final position and/or random basis.

24.2. Additional Controls

Additional athletes, such as those achieving National Records who have not been selected for doping control, may present themselves for testing. These athletes must report to the TIC where they will have to complete the “Doping Control Request Form”. They will then be escorted to the DCC.

The cost of this control – 500 euro - must be paid for on site by the requesting club to the LOC.

25. Medical services

25.1. General

Each participating club team is responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover illness or injury to any member of their party when travelling to and from and during the ECCC Track & Field Senior (European Athletics Regulation 1410.9). Please take the necessary steps to fulfil these requirements well in advance: In addition, **participating teams are requested to present a copy of the insurance policy during the accreditation procedure or send a copy of the document in advance to info@atletismecastello.es.**

The medical service is in charge of any medical assistance to the team leaders, the competition organisation, the information personnel, the honorary guests as well as, during the competition, to the spectators in the Stadium.

In case of an emergency please contact the nearest medical aid station. In other cases the given instructions should be followed. Below is information on the medical care sites and relevant instructions. The LOC doctor is in charge of the medical service and can be reached on +359 883 406 100

25.2. Medical services in the hotel

In case of any emergency, you should either call 112 or contact the hotels' Information/Reception Desks.

25.3. Medical care at the stadium

The Stadium medical service is responsible for any problems concerning the athletes' health. The team doctor has access to the medical service facilities when an athlete of his/her own team is hurt or is in need of other medical attention. The Stadium medical service is also responsible for first aid in the warming up area.

The medical point will be located in the Stadium (please see Appendix 3) and will be open during training and competition days/hours. There will also be one ambulance (first aid teams) in the infield, supervised by a doctor and marked with red crosses on training and competition days/hours.

25.4. Physiotherapy in the hotels

For those teams requiring physiotherapy services there will be – upon prior request at the Hotels' Information Desks and at the teams' cost - a physiotherapist available in the following schedule:

- Friday 22 May 20:00-22:00
- Saturday 23 May 20:00-22:00
- Sunday 24 May 20:00-22:00

Additionally, each team's Hotel will have a dedicated room for physiotherapy – also upon prior request at the Information Desk - where team delegations may find and use massage beds provided by the LOC.

25.5. Physiotherapy in the stadium

There are well equipped physiotherapy facilities in connection with the Medical Centre. The team physiotherapists and doctors may use the equipment in the physiotherapy rooms in co-operation with the medical staff.

In addition, a dedicated area will be reserved at the Warm-up Area for the teams' physiotherapist, where one LOC physiotherapist (in case of need), physiotherapy boxes, tables and ice machines will be available during both the training sessions and the competition days (please see Appendix 3).

25.6. Security

Instructions given by the LOC, the security personnel and the police must be followed in all areas, as well as during transport from one location to another.

The accreditation card must be worn at all times. If an accreditation is lost, this should be reported immediately to any LOC Information Desk.

If necessary, the police can be contacted through the LOC Information Desk at your Hotel.

For further information, please check point 5.7. Above.

26. Ceremonies

26.1. Victory ceremonies

The victory ceremonies for the winning teams Men and Women will take place at the Stadium on Sunday 24 May at 14:00. Athletes must wear the official team clothing for the ceremonies.

No flags and no team Officials shall be allowed on the podium during the victory ceremonies.

26.2. Departures

Teams will be asked to provide full travel details in the final entry system. Teams will also receive a departure form, which should be completed and returned to the LOC Information Desks in the Hotels, at least 24 hours before departure, especially if there are any changes to the preliminary confirmed details.

Departure times of the shuttle buses from the Hotels will be provided and displayed at the Hotels 'Information Desks.

All outstanding fees, charges and possible other expenses must be settled with the cashier. On the day of departure, the LOC hotel managers check the rooms together with the team leaders.

Pole vaults will be put onto the team buses to return home / go to the airport.
